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Call for Papers

The Silicon Valley Engineering Council Journal invites member organizations and the broader engineering community to submit papers for its 2010 issue (Vol. 2). The target audience for the journal includes Silicon Valley Engineering Council (SVEC) members, practitioners of engineering disciplines, students and policy-makers.

Papers on any and all topic of relevance to the goals and missions of the Silicon Valley Engineering Council (SVEC) are welcome. Preference will be given to papers which are likely to appeal to a broad range of multidisciplinary readership. Of particular interest are articles that reflect upon the historical or future development, evolution or application of specific engineering technologies within the context of Silicon Valley.

Examples of subjects of interest to the SVEC audience include, but are not limited to: astronautics and aeronautics; systems engineering; chemical and manufacturing processes; civil engineering, mechanical engineering; bioengineering; metallurgy; materials science and engineering; electronics and communications; information technology; nanotechnology; emerging trends; engineering education; public policy; and others. Topics may be field-specific, such as case studies within a specific discipline; generic, such as modeling technologies that may be applicable to a variety of disciplines; or cross-disciplinary and widely used technologies.

Typical page length will vary by the type of article. Short communications or position papers will typically be 2-4 two-column pages; technical papers may be 6-8 two-column pages; while review articles may be 8-10 two-column pages in length. All papers are subject to review by the editorial board of the journal.

Preliminary abstracts are requested by June 15; with full papers due by September 15. Final copies of all papers, along with copyright transfer, will be required by October 15.

Interested authors or volunteers are requested to contact Amip Shah (amip.shah@hp.com) with a short text-only abstract not to exceed 1,000 words. Upon acceptance, a template with formatting instructions for the full paper will be provided.
